A Great Start to the New Year!

We are now in our third week of term already and children have settled back in wonderfully. All are working hard and school is calm and productive.

We have had some exciting things happening already this term. You then write '20+C+M+B+19' above the door of your home as a request to Christ to bless your home and all who visit it. The letters represent the initials of the Magi-Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar.

The + sign represents the cross and the numbers mark the year. CMB also stands for 'Christus mansionem benedicat' which means, 'May Christ bless this house.'
