

Class 2 Autumn Term Project Tasks

Here are some tasks and activities that you can do at home relating to the topics we will be covering in school in the Autumn Term.

<p><u>Science: Uses of everyday materials</u> Try placing different everyday objects into a bag and ask your child to guess what the object is using their sense of touch, which features of the object lead them to their guess? Do metal objects feel cold for example?</p>	<p><u>Science: Uses of everyday materials</u> Select a variety of materials and predict whether they can be squashed, bent, twisted or stretched by hand and if you think they will return to their original shape. Good materials to try would be play dough, fabric, paper, soft balls, hard balls, a wooden rolling pin and a metal pan. Test your predictions, were they correct?</p>	<p><u>Science: Seasonal Change</u> Go on a walk and look for signs of Autumn. What changes can you see, hear and smell? Watch the weather for a week and see how it changes.</p>
<p><u>History: Why are some places special?</u> Think about significant landmarks in the North East for example the Angel of the North, Tyne Bridge, Durham Cathedral. Find out about when they were built and why. If possible, go and visit these.</p>	<p><u>Geography: Why is my world wonderful?</u> Use an Atlas or a globe and find the 7 different continents. Can you name them all? Can you find which continent we live in? Have you or your family ever visited a different continent?</p>	<p><u>Art: Why is my world wonderful?</u> The primary colours are red, yellow and blue. Can you find out what colours you get when you mix these together?</p>
<p><u>Computing: Information Technology</u> Become a super-fast word processor! Type your name, shopping lists, letters to friends and grandparents. Try to use both hands when you are typing and not just one finger at a time!</p>	<p><u>Design and Technology: Structures</u> Read the story of The Three Little Pigs. Why do you think the third little pig had the strongest house? Make some model houses and test them (use a hairdryer for the wolf!)</p>	<p><u>Music: Why is my world wonderful?</u> Listen to different music from around the world and think about how it is the same and different. Find your favourite piece of music about an animal and think about why it makes you remember that animal.</p>
